Setting up service on your new phone is quick and easy. This section walks you through the necessary steps to unlock your phone, set up your voicemail, establish passwords, and contact Sprint for assistance with your Sprint service.

Setting Up Your Phone

- Install the battery. (See "Installing the Battery" on page 16.)
 - Press the cover release and remove the battery cover from the back of the phone.
 - Insert the battery into the opening, making sure the connectors align. Gently press down to secure the battery.
 - Replace the battery cover and slide it forward until you hear a click.
- 2. Press to turn the phone on.
 - If your phone is activated, it will turn on, search for Sprint service, and enter standby mode.
 - If your phone is not yet activated, see "Activating Your Phone" on page 3 for more information.
- 3. Make your first call.
 - "Use your keypad to enter a phone number.
 - Press TALK



Your phone's battery should have enough charge for your phone to turn on and find a signal, set up your voicernail, and make a call. You should fully charge your battery as soon as possible. See "Charging the Battery" on page 17 for details.

Activating Your Phone

- If you purchased your phone at a Sprint Store, your phone should be activated and ready to use.
- If you received your phone in the mail and it is for a new Sprint account or a new line of service, your phone is designed to activate automatically when you first turn it on. To confirm your activation, make a phone call.
- If you received your phone in the mail and you are activating a new phone for an existing number on your account, you will need to contact Sprint Customer Service to activate your new phone. There are two activation options:
 - From your computer's Web browser, go to www.sprint.com/activate and complete the onscreen instructions to activate your phone.

 Dial 1-888-211-4727 from another phone to contact Sprint Customer Service to complete the phone activation.

When you have finished, make a phone call to confirm your activation.

If your phone is still not activated, call Sprint Customer Service at 1-888-211-4727 for assistance.

Do not press while the phone is being activated. Pressing cancels the activation process.

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Setting Up Your Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. Therefore, Sprint recommends that you set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated.

- From standby mode, press and hold 1.
- Follow the system prompts to:
 - "Create your passcode.
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.
 - Choose whether to activate One-Iouch Message Access (a feature that lets you access messages simply by pressing and holding , bypassing the need for you to enter your passcode).

Note

Voicemail Passcode

If you are concerned about unauthorized access to your voicemail account, Sprint recommends that you enable your voicemail passcode. (Do not activate One-Touch Message Access.)

Sprint Account Passwords

As a Sprint customer, you enjoy unlimited access to your personal account information, your voicemail account, and your data services account. To ensure that no one else has access to your information, you will need to create passwords to protect your privacy.

Account Username and Password

If you are the account owner, you will create an account username and password when you sign on to www.sprint.com. (Click Need to register for access? to get started.) If you are not the account owner (if someone else receives the bill for your Sprint service), you can get a sub-account password at www.sprint.com.

Voicemail Password

You'll create your voicemail password (or passcode) when you set up your voicemail. See "Setting Up Your Voicemail" on page 4 for more information on your voicemail password.

Data Services Password

With your Sprint phone, you may elect to set up an optional data services password to control access and authorize Premium Service purchases.

There is a per-call charge to use Sprint 411, and you will be billed for airtime.

Your phone is packed with features that simplify your life and expand your ability to stay connected to the people and information that are important to you. This section will guide you through the basic functions and calling features of your phone.



Key Functions

- Earpiece lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.
- Signal Strength Indicator represents the signal strength by displaying bars. The more bars displayed, the better the signal strength.
- Main LCD (display) displays all the information needed to operate your phone, such as the call status, the Contacts list, the date and time, and the signal and battery strength.
- Navigation Key scrolls through the phone's menu options and acts as a shortcut key from standby mode.
 - Press Up to access Missed Alerts.
 - Press Down to access My Content.
 - Press Right to launch the Web.
 - Press Left to launch Send Text Message.
- Softkey (left) lets you select softkey actions or menu items corresponding to the bottom left line on the Main LCD.

- MENU/OK lets you access the phone's menus and selects the highlighted choice when navigating through a menu.
- TALK Key allows you to place or receive calls, answer Call Waiting, use Three-Way Calling, or activate Voice Dial.
- BACK Key deletes characters from the display in text entry mode. When in a menu, pressing the Back key returns you to the previous menu. This key also allows you to return to the previous screen in a data session.
- Keypad lets you enter numbers, letters, and characters, and navigate within menus. Press and hold keys 0–9 for speed dialing.
- Microphone allows other callers to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- 11. END/POWER Key lets you turn the phone on or oft, end a call, or return to standby mode. While in the main menu, it returns the phone to standby mode and cancels your input. When you receive an incoming call, press to enter silent mode and mute the ringer.

- Softkey (right) lets you select softkey actions or menu items corresponding to the bottom right line on the Main LCD.
- 13. Battery Strength Indicator represents the amount of remaining battery charge currently available in your phone. When all bars are displayed in the battery icon, the phone's battery is fully charged. When no bars are displayed, the phone's battery is completely discharged or empty.
- Camera Lens, as part of the built-in camera, lets you take pictures and videos.
- 15. Volume Button allows you to adjust the ringer volume in standby mode (with the phone open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. The volume key can also be used to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options.
- Sub LCD lets you monitor the phone's status and see who's calling without opening the phone.
- Charger/Accessories Jack allows you to connect a USB cable. CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.

- 18. Headset Jack allows you to plug in either a stereo headset (included) or an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations. CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.
- Side Camera Button lets you activate the camera and video mode and take pictures and videos.

Viewing the Display Screen

Your phone's display screen provides information about your phone's status and options. This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your phone's display screen:

indicates data services status. (The icon is animated while service is active.)



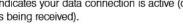
indicates your data connection is active (data is being transmitted).

indicates your data connection is active (data is being received).



indicates data connection is dormant (no data is being sent or received).



indicates your phone's location feature is on.



indicates your phone's location feature is off.

indicates your phone is using SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) protocol for client/server communication.



indicates you are "roaming" off the Sprint National Network.



indicates you have new text message.



indicates you have an urgent unread text message.



indicates there is an unread Text VoiceSMS message in your Inbox.



indicates the Text VoiceSMS message has been read.



indicates there is an unread VoiceSMS message in your Inbox.



indicates you have listened to the SMS Voice message.



indicates your message is locked.



indicates the ringer volume is set to vibrate.



indicates your phone is operating in TTY mode.



indicates your phone has a ringer volume set



and the vibrate option is checked. indicates the ringer is set at a level between



1 - 8 or that 1-Beep is selected.



indicates your phone's ringer is turned off and the vibrate option is enabled.



indicates your ringer is turned off and the vibrate option is not enabled (Silence Mode).



indicates the onboard microphone is muted.
