## Your Phone at a Glance

The following illustration outlines your phone's primary external features and buttons.



## Set Up Your Phone

You must first install and charge the battery to begin setting up your phone.

- 1. Install the battery.
  - Insert a coin or other flat object into the slot at the top of the battery compartment cover and lift the cover up gently.



Insert the battery, contacts end first, and gently press the battery into place.



 Replace the battery compartment cover, making sure all the tabs are secure and there are no gaps around the cover.

**Note:** When you insert the battery, your phone may power on automatically.

2. Plug the USB connector into the charger/accessory jack on the bottom of your phone.



3. Plug the AC adapter into an electrical outlet and charge your battery. Fully charging a battery may take up to three hours.

**Note:** Your phone's battery should have enough charge for the phone to turn on and find a signal, run the setup application, set up voicemail, and make a call. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.

4. Press and hold to turn the phone on.



- If your phone is activated, it will turn on, search for Sprint service, and begin the setup application.
- If your phone is not yet activated, see Activate Your Phone for more information.

## Activate Your Phone

Depending on your account or how and where you purchased your phone, it may be ready to use or you may need to activate it on your Sprint account.

- If you purchased your phone at a Sprint Store, it is probably activated and ready to use.
- If you received your phone in the mail and it is for a new Sprint account or a new line of service, it is designed to activate automatically.
  - When you turn the phone on for the first time, you should see a Hands Free
     Activation screen, which may be followed by a PRL Update screen and a Firmware
     Update screen. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.
- If you received your phone in the mail and you are activating a new phone for an existing number on your account (you're swapping phones), you can activate on your computer online or directly on your phone.
  - Activate on your computer:

- Go to sprint.com/activate and complete the online instructions to activate your phone.
- Activate on your phone:
  - Turn on your new phone. (Make sure the old one is turned off.) Your phone will automatically attempt Hands-Free Activation.
  - Tap Activate to override auto-activation and start the manual activation wizard.
  - Follow the onscreen prompts to complete the activation process.
- To confirm activation, make a phone call. If your phone is still not activated or you do not have access to the Internet, contact Sprint Customer Service at 1-888-211-4727 for assistance.

**Tip:** Do not press the **Power** button while the phone is being activated. Pressing the **Power** button cancels the activation process.

**Note:** If you are having any difficulty with activation, contact Sprint Customer Service by calling **1-888-211-4727** from any other phone.

## Set Up Voicemail

You should set up your Sprint Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Always use a password to protect against unauthorized access. Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off.

- 1. From standby mode, press and hold to dial your voicemail number.
- 2. Follow the system prompts to:
  - Create your password.
  - Record your name announcement.
  - Record your greeting.

**Note:** Voicemail Password – Sprint strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your phone is able to access your voicemail messages.

## Sprint Account Passwords

As a Sprint customer, you enjoy unlimited access to your personal account information, your voicemail account, and your data services account. To ensure that no one else has access to your information, you will need to create passwords to protect your privacy.

#### Account User Name and Password

If you are the account owner, you will create an account user name and password when you sign on to sprint.com. (Click **Sign in/Sign up** and then click **Sign up now!** to get started.) If you are not the account owner (if someone else receives the bill for your Sprint service), you can get a sub-account password at sprint.com.

#### Voicemail Password

You'll create your voicemail password when you set up your voicemail. See Set Up Voicemail for more information on your voicemail password.

#### Data Services Password

With your Sprint phone, you may elect to set up an optional data services password to control access and authorize Premium Service purchases.

There is a per-call charge to use Sprint 411, and you will be billed for airtime.

## Your Phone's Layout

The following illustrations outline your phone's basic layout.



#### **Key Functions**

The following list defines the features listed in the above illustrations.

• **Earpiece** lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.

- QWERTY Option Key (left) lets you select softkey actions or menu items using the QWERTY keyboard.
- **Display Screen** displays all the information needed to operate your phone, such as the call status, the Contacts list, the date and time, and the greeting.
- QWERTY Option Key (right) lets you select softkey actions or menu items using the QWERTY keyboard.
- Navigation Key scrolls through the phone's menu options and acts as a shortcut key from standby mode.
- Option Key (left) lets you select softkey actions or menu items corresponding to the bottom left and bottom right lines on the Display Screen.
- Talk Key allows you to place or receive calls, answer Call Waiting, use 3-Way Calling, or activate Voice Dial.
- Speaker Key to route the phone's audio through the speaker or through the earpiece.
- Voicemail Key lets you access your voicemail by pressing and holding this button.
- **MENU/OK Key** lets you access the phone's menus and selects the highlighted choice when navigating through a menu.
- Option Key (right) lets you select softkey actions or menu items corresponding to the bottom right and bottom right lines on the Display Screen.
- End/Power Key lets you turn the phone on or off, end a call, or return to standby mode. While in the main menu, it returns the phone to standby mode and cancels your input. When you receive an incoming call, press to mute the ringtone or ignore the call.
- Back Key deletes characters from the display in text entry mode. When in a menu, pressing the Back key returns you to the previous menu, closes a dialog box, or exits an onscreen menu/option.



- Volume Keys allow you to adjust the ringtone volume in standby mode or adjust the
  voice volume during a call. The volume button can also be used to scroll up or down to
  navigate through the different menu options.
- Charger/Accessory Jack allows you to connect the phone charger or an optional USB cable.
- Camera Button lets you activate the camera.

**CAUTION!** Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the phone.

## Turn Your Phone On and Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your phone on and off.

#### Turn Your Phone On or Off

► Press and hold

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

## Your Home Screen

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus.



### Status Bar

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides phone and service status information on the right side and notification alerts on the left.

## Entering Text Using the Keypad

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter letters, numbers, and symbols whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding a Contacts entry or when using text messaging). For more information, see Text Messaging and MMS.

#### **ABC Mode**

In Abc mode, also known as multi-tap entry, you press keys one, two, three, or four times to enter the letters you see on the keypad. For example, press once for "a," twice for "b", or three times for "c"; or press once for "p," twice for "q," three times for "r," or four times for "s."

- Select the Abc mode
- 2. Press the corresponding keys repeatedly until the correct letter appears. (For example, to enter the word "Bill," press twice, twice, three times, and three times again.) (If you make a mistake, press to erase a single character. Press and hold to erase an entire word.)

By default, the first letter of an entry is capitalized and the following letters are lowercased. After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character on a different key.

#### Entering Numbers, Symbols, Smileys and Preset Messages

To enter numbers:

Select the 123 mode and press the appropriate key

To enter symbols:

➤ Select the Symbols mode. To enter a symbol, press the appropriate key indicated on the display.

To enter "emoticons" (smileys):

► Select the Smileys mode and press the appropriate key.

To enter preset messages:

- Select the Add Preset Message mode.
- 2. Highlight a message and press ...

**Note**: Preset messages make composing text messages easier by allowing you to enter quick messages, such as "Meet me at," "Can I call you?," or a customized message of your own.

## Entering Text Using the Samsung QWERTY Keyboard

The Samsung Array™ has a full, slide-out QWERTY keyboard. The keyboard is located beneath the display screen and is accessed by sliding it open. This orients the device's display to Landscape (widescreen) mode.

With the QWERTY keyboard, you can type letters, numbers, punctuation, and other special characters into text entry fields or other applications as easily as with your computer. For more information, see Text Messaging and MMS.

#### Open the Device and Access the Keyboard

- 1. Rotate the device 90 degrees counter-clockwise.
- 2. Slide the top section of the device up to open, as shown in the illustration. When you slide the device open, the display rotates from a vertical viewing mode (Portrait) to a horizontal viewing mode (Landscape).



### Using the Keyboard

In this section we'll cover the steps necessary to enter text using the QWERTY keyboard. Using your device's QWERTY keyboard is just like using any standard computer keyboard.



The following keys perform special functions when entering text:

Icon	Description
Fn	<b>FN</b> : Allows you to use alternate characters displayed at the top of the QWERTY keys. Examples: \$, @, #, !
Û	Shift: Changes the text input mode among Upper/Lower/Mixed case mode.
Sym	<b>SYM</b> : Launches the Symbols page. Scroll down and tap an entry from the extensive list of emoticons.
Space (#ik	Space: Inserts an empty space.
OK	OK/Enter: Selects or accepts a currently highlighted option.
Ø	<b>Delete</b> : Deletes the previous character, similar to the backspace key on a computer keyboard.
1	Return: Inserts a new line into the text field.

From a text entry screen, use the keyboard to enter different character types. Select one of the following character types:

- Letters to enter the alphabetic characters associated with each key.
- **Numbers** to enter numbers by pressing the numbers on the keyboard.

• **Symbols** to enter symbols.

**Tip**: When entering text, press to change letter capitalization (**Abc** > **ABC** > **abc**).

The keyboard provides dual-use keys labeled with alphabetic characters on the lower half and numbers and symbols on the upper half. Press the key corresponding to the orange character you want to enter.

#### Access Additional QWERTY Text Editing Options

- 1. Touch and hold an active text entry field.
- 2. From the Edit text context menu, tap an available function:
  - Select word highlights the characters of the last entered word in the text message field.
  - Select all highlights all characters in the text message field.
  - Input method provides additional text input methods, if available. The default is the Swype keyboard.
  - Add "device" to dictionary adds the currently highlighted word to your device's dictionary.

## Call Using the Keypad

Making calls is as easy as entering a phone number and pressing the **Talk** key.

- 1. Enter a phone number from standby mode. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press to erase the numbers.)
- 2. Press . (To make a call when you are roaming and Call Guard is enabled, highlight Roam Call and press .
- 3. Press when you are finished.

**Tip**: To redial your last outgoing call, press twice. To redial other recent numbers, press again.

You can also place calls from your phone by speed dialing numbers from your Contacts using your History listings and Voice Services.

## Call from History

You can make a call directly from your History list.

- 1. Press > History.
- 2. Highlight an entry and press

Note: You cannot make calls from History to entries identified as No Caller ID or Restricted.

#### Call from Contacts


You can dial phone numbers directly from your Contacts list.

- 1. Press > CONTACTS.
- 2. Highlight the contact you want to call and press to dial the entry's default phone number.
- 3. Highlight a phone number and press > Call.

## Call a Number in a Text Message

While viewing a text message, you can place a call to a number that is in the body of the message. For more information, see Text Messaging and MMS.

- 1. Press > Messages.
- 2. Select the message that contains the phone number.
- 3. Highlight the phone number and press

## Call Emergency Numbers

You can place emergency calls to 911, even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

**Note**: When you place an emergency call, your phone automatically enters Emergency mode.

#### View Options During an Emergency Call

- ► Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) to view the following:
  - My Phone # (left softkey) to display your MSID and device phone number during an emergency call.
  - **Unlock** (right softkey) to unlock your phone (appears only if the phone is locked).

#### Exit Emergency Mode

► Press to end a 911 call.

#### Enhanced 911 (E911) Information

This phone features an embedded Global Positioning System (GPS) chip necessary for utilizing E911 emergency location services where available.

When you place an emergency 911 call, the GPS feature of your phone seeks information to calculate your approximate location. Depending on several variables, including availability and access to satellite signals, it may take up to 30 seconds or more to determine and report your approximate location.

Important:

Always report your location to the 911 operator when placing an emergency call. Some designated emergency call takers, known as Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs) may not be equipped to receive GPS location information from your phone.

## Receive Phone Calls

There are several convenient ways to answer calls on your phone.

- 1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail.)
- 2. Press to answer an incoming call. (Depending on your settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any number key.

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings or vibrates.
- The indicator light flashes.
- The backlight illuminates.
- The screen displays an incoming call message.

If the incoming call is from a number stored in your Contacts, the entry's name is displayed. You may also see the caller's phone number, if available.

If you set **CALL ANSWER** to **Talk Key**, you also see the following options. To select an option, press the corresponding softkey.

- Answer to answer the incoming call.
- **Silence** to set the ringer to silent mode.
- Send to VoiceMail redirects the call to your voicemail.
- **Ignore with Text** to immediately send the caller a text message.

#### Answering a Roam Call with Call Guard Enabled

Call Guard is an option that helps you manage your roaming charges when making or receiving calls while outside the Nationwide Sprint Network.

Select Answer to answer the call.

Note: When your phone is off, calls go directly to voicemail.

#### Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you to a new message.

- By sounding the assigned ringtone type.
- By displaying within the Notifications area of the Status bar when a single new unheard voicemail message is received.

#### Retrieve Your Voicemail

- 3. Enter your password.

### **Dialing Options**

When you enter numbers in standby mode, you will see a variety of dialing options displayed as softkeys on the phone's screen.

#### **Initiate Dialing Options**

- Press OPTIONS (right softkey).
  - Save: Enter a seven-digit or ten-digit number (phone number and area code) and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Save to save the phone number in your Contacts.
  - Hard Pause: Enter a seven-digit or ten-digit number (phone number and area code) and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Hard Pause. This inserts a pause between the dialed phone number and the next entered digits.

**Note**: Use this feature to navigate through automated menus. If you know the number sequence required to connect you to the right destination, enter a **Hard Pause** between each number. **A Hard Pause** entry displays a "p". For example: (214) 555-7777p1p2p3

 2-Sec Pause: Enter a seven-digit or ten-digit number (phone number and area code) and press OPTIONS (right softkey) > 2-Sec Pause. This inserts a longer pause between the dialed phone number and the next entered digits.

**Note**: Use this feature to navigate through automated menus. If you know the number sequence required to connect you to the right destination and the menu prompts require more time to accept your number choice, enter a **2-Sec Pause** between each number. A **2-Sec Pause** entry displays a "t". For example: (214) 555-7777t5t6t7.

## 3-way Calling

With 3-Way calling, you can talk to two people who are on two different phone lines at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

- 1. Place your call to the first recipient.
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **3-way call**. (Your first call is automatically put on hold.)
- 3. Select one of the following:
  - Contacts to choose a caller from your Contacts list.
  - Recent History to use your History list to locate a call recipient
  - Enter phone number to manually enter the call recipient's phone number.
- 4. Press after you highlight the appropriate contact or enter the phone number.
- 5. When you're connected to the second party, press **JOIN** (right softkey) to combine both calls into a single 3-way call.

**Note**: If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

## In-call Options

Pressing **OPTIONS** (right softkey) during a call displays a list of available in-call features. Pressing **MUTE/UNMUTE** (left softkey) silences and unsilences the speaker.

To select an option, press the corresponding keypad number or highlight the option and press. The following options may be available through the Options menu:

- Speaker Key ( ) to route the phone's audio through the speaker or through the earpiece.
- Save to add the incoming caller's number to an existing contact or save it as a new one.
- 3-Way Call to initiate a 3-way call.
- Contacts to display your Contacts list.
- Voice Memo to record the current call.
- **Phone Info** to display your phone information.
- **Key Mute** to silence the key tones.

**Note**: After selecting this option, the menu item changes to Key Unmute. Select this option to unmute the keys.

- Messages to display your current messages (Voicemail, text messages, etc.).
- Recent History to view your call histories.
- Tools to access the Tools menu.

## Speed Dialing

You can store up to 98 numbers in your phone's speed dial memory. Dial speed dial entries using one keypress for locations 2–9 or two key presses for locations 10–99.

#### Use One-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial Locations 2–9

▶ Press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds. The display confirms that you have dialed the number when it shows "connecting...".

#### Use Two-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial Locations 10–99

- 1. Press the first digit.
- 2. Press and hold the second digit for approximately two seconds. The display confirms that you have dialed the number when it shows "connecting...".

## Plus (+) Code Dialing

When placing international calls, Plus Code Dialing automatically enters the international access code for your location (for example, 011 for international calls made from the U.S.).

- 1. Press and hold until you see a "+" on the display screen.
- 2. Dial the country code and phone number, and then press . (The phone automatically prepends the access code for international dialing, followed by the country code and phone number.)

The History feature of the Phone application lists all recent incoming, outgoing, and missed calls.

The following procedures will guide you through viewing your call history list.

- 1. Press > History.
- 2. Highlight an entry and press

**Note**: History record only calls that occur while the phone is turned on. If a call is received while your phone is turned off, it will not be included in history.

If you return a call from the voicemail menu, it will not be included in your phone's history.



     Predictive Text entry mode. Choose Display Language to use the current language used for the phone's displays, or select English or Spanish.
  - Personal Dictionary: Manage a dictionary of words to be used with XT9 Predictive Text. To edit a word, highlight a word in the list, or enter criteria to find a word, then press Options for editing options. Press ADD to add a new word.
  - Word Choice List: Set to On to have a list of possible matches display as you enter text in XT9 Predictive Text entry mode, or Off.
  - Word Prediction: Set to On to have XT9 Predictive Text predict the next word, or choose Off.
  - Word Completion: Set to On to have XT9 Predictive Text insert the most likely matching word entered automatically as you enter text, or choose Off.
  - Use My Words: Set to On to have XT9 Predictive Text use words from your Personal Dictionary over other possible matches, or choose Off.
  - **Help**: View information about XT9 Predictive Text.

# Phone Information

Your phone provides information specific to your phone, such as the phone number, memory status, an icon glossary, your phone's software version, and information about your account.

1. Press > Settings > Phone Information.

The following information is available:

- Phone Number/User ID displays your phone number and identification information.
- Memory Status displays the total available memory on your device.

- **Icon Glossary** displays the icons used in your phone's display.
- Version displays information about your phone's settings and browser information.

- My Account displays your account details and allows you to hear your current minute usage and account balance.
- 2. Press **DONE** (left softkey) when finished viewing the information.

## Lock Phone

When your phone is locked you can only receive incoming calls and make calls to 911, Sprint Customer Service, or special numbers.

# Location

Your phone is equipped with a Location feature for use in connection with location-based services.

The Location feature allows the network to detect your position. Turning Location off will hide your location from everyone except 911.

Note: Turning Location on will allow the network to detect your position using GPS technology, making some Sprint applications and services easier to use. Turning Location off will disable the GPS location function for all purposes except 911, but will not hide your general location based on the cell site serving your call. No application or service may use your location without your request or permission. GPS-enhanced 911 is not available in all areas.

To enable your phone's Location feature:

- 1. Press > Settings > Location. (The Location disclaimer displays.)
- 2. Read the disclaimer and press
- 3. Highlight **On** or **Off** and press
- 4. Press **DONE** (left softkey).

When you turn the Location feature on, the phone displays the icon. When you turn Location off, the phone displays the icon.

## Parental Controls

Parental Controls provide restrictions to various phone services such as Voice, Messaging, Data, and Camera. These restrictions are governed by an independent Parental Code that is separate from the previously mentioned Lock code.

## Using Parental Controls

With your phone's parental controls settings, you can disable certain phone services without turning off your phone. You can restrict access to all data services, including Web and text messaging. Disabling data services will avoid any charges associated with these services.

While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may enable data services again at any time.

#### **Enable Parental Controls**

- 1. Press > Settings > Parental Controls.
- 2. Use the navigation keys to toggle Parental Controls On.
- 3. If this is your first time to setup these controls, you will be asked to setup a parental lock code that manages the areas that will be locked via this menu.
  - Enter a new four-digit Lock code.
  - Re-enter the new code and press DONE (left softkey).

#### **Disable Parental Controls**

- 1. Press > Settings > Parental Controls.
- 2. Use the navigation keys to toggle Parental Controls Off.
- 3. Enter your four-digit code and press **DONE** (left softkey).

## Changing the Parental Control Code

You can change your parental control code.

## Customize Parental Controls Restrictions

Customize your parental controls options, such as preventing outgoing calls, restricting text messaging, Web access, or camera use.

**Note**: The Parental Control Restrictions that you set on your phone do not reflect those configured on Sprint.com. For online configuration information, sign in to My Sprint, select the **My Preferences** tab, and select a control feature within **Limits and Restrictions**.

- Camera/Camcorder to restrict access to the Camera functionality.

- 3. If you are certain that you would like to restore all factory settings, press **RESET** (left softkey).

### Delete Stuff

You can choose specific content to delete, rather than resetting the entire phone to its default state.

Select how to answer incoming calls on your phone: whether you want to press the **Talk** key, to press any number key, or simply to open the phone.

  - Talk Key to require you to press to answer all incoming calls.


Your phone's Accessibility settings let you take advantage of the built-in automatic speech recognition software.

## Voice Recognition

You can use your phone's built-in automatic speech recognition (ASR) software to dial a phone number in your Contacts or to launch phone functions. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and ASR will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself.

- 1. Press > Settings > Others > Accessibility > Voice Recognition.
- 2. Select **Confirmation** and select an option.
  - Automatic to ask for confirmation only when the system is not sure what you said.
  - Always Confirm to always ask for confirmation.
  - Never Confirm to never ask for confirmation.

#### Voice Guide

Voice Guide provides audible output of selected menu items. For example, in **GRID VIEW** of the main menu, if you highlight you will hear "Contacts".

To enable Voice Guide:

## Airplane Mode

Airplane Mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Camera, Calculator, Calendar, and Voice Memos, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited. When you set your phone to Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information.



- 2. Read the disclaimer and press **OK** (left softkey).

Note: While in Airplane Mode, your phone's standby screen will display "Phone off."

### Data

Data settings on your phone help prevent accidental connections to the Web.

#### **Net Guard**

When you first connect to the Web, the Net Guard will be displayed to confirm that you want to connect. This feature helps you avoid accidental connections. You can disable the Net Guard in the future by selecting **Always Auto-Connect** when the Net Guard is displayed.

To change your Net Guard settings:

- ► Press > Settings > Others > Data > Net Guard.
  - Select On to activate the Net Guard.
  - Select Off to deactivate the Net Guard.

Note: When enabled, the Net Guard appears only once as long as you have not turned the phone off and on.

### **Update Data Profile**

If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, you must then update the user name on your phone.

► Press > Settings > Others > Data > Update Data Profile. (To cancel, press before completing the update.)

## Contact Match

The Contact Match feature allows you to choose whether or not contacts matching the numbers you enter into the keypad display under the entry screen. This feature is turned on by default.

#### Turn Off Contact Match

- 1. Press > Settings > Others > Contact Match.
- 2. Highlight **Off** and press


## Roaming

When you're roaming on digital networks, your call quality and security will be similar to the quality you receive when making calls on the Nationwide Sprint Network. However, you may not be able to access certain features, such as data services, depending on the available network.

#### **Data Roam Guard**

Depending on service availability and roaming agreements, your phone may be able to access data services while roaming on certain digital systems. You can set your phone to alert you when you are roaming off the Nationwide Sprint Network and try to use data services such as messaging.

To set your Data Roam Guard notification:



To use data services when Data Roam Guard is active:

▶ When a pop-up notification appears informing you that data roam charges may apply, press DONE (left softkey) to connect.

## Setting Roam Mode

Your phone allows you to control your roaming capabilities. By using the Roaming menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts. Choose from three different settings on your dual-band phone to control your roaming experience.

**Note**: If you're on a call when you leave the Nationwide Sprint Network, your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think Sprint service is available, turn your phone off and on again to reconnect to the network.

- 1. Press > Settings > Others > Roaming > Roaming Mode.
- 2. Highlight an option and press
  - Sprint Only to access only the Nationwide Sprint Network and prevent roaming on other networks.
  - Automatic to seek service on the Nationwide Sprint Network. When Sprint service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.

## Roaming Settings

1. Press > Settings > Others > Roaming > Roaming Settings.

- 2. Highlight an option and press .
  - Domestic Voice to restrict roaming mode during domestic voice calls.
  - Domestic Data to restrict roaming mode during domestic data usage.
  - International Voice to restrict roaming mode during international voice calls.
  - International Data to restrict roaming mode during international data usage.

## Language

You can choose to display your phone's onscreen menus in English or in Spanish.

- 1. Press > Settings > Others > Language.
- 2. Highlight **English** or **Español** and press



You can use the Contacts settings menu to both set up and view information pertaining to your Contacts list.

  - Speed Dials to view all numbers assigned to the speed dial list.
  - Hide/Show Secret to view the list of hidden contacts.
  - My Name Card to enter information into a new personal name card or view information in your existing name card.
  - Services to access shortcut dialing numbers for customer services.

## TTY Options

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications phone that allows people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone. Your phone is compatible with select TTY phones. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY phone to ensure that it is compatible with digital cell phones. Your phone and TTY phone will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY phone, contact your TTY phone manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

# Get Started With Contacts

Your phone automatically sorts the Contacts entries alphabetically. Your phone can store up to 600 Contacts entries. Contacts entries can store up to a total of 4200 phone numbers, and each entry's name can contain 64 characters.

► From the Home Screen, press **CONTACTS** (right softkey).

#### **Contacts List Options**

1. Highlight an entry and press > **OPTIONS** (right softkey).

  - **Services** to access shortcut dialing numbers for customer services. See Sprint Support Services for more information.

# Add a Contact

- Vib to assign a vibration pattern to accompany incoming calls from the new contact.
- URL to add a website's URL to the entry.
- Address to enter a physical address for the contact.
- Birthday to add a birth date to the entry's information card.
- Memo to add a note, street address, or other information.
- Job Title to add the entry's business or organization position title.
- Company to enter business information such as a company name.
- 7. To assign a speed dial number, highlight the new phone number and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Set Speed Dial**.

After saving the number, your phone displays the new entry.

# Save a Phone Number

Save a number from standby mode by entering the number and accessing the Options menu. You can also label the number by type, such as mobile, home, work, pager, fax, or others.

- 1. Enter a phone number and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Save**.
- 2. Highlight **New Contact** or **Existing Contact** and press
- 3. Highlight a label for the entry (**Mobile**, **Home**, **Work**, **Pager**, **Fax**, or **Others**) and press
- 4. Enter the new contact name and press **DONE** (left softkey) to save the new entry.
  - or -
- 1. Search for an existing contact name and press to save the new number.
- 2. Highlight a label for the entry (**Mobile**, **Home**, **Work**, **Pager**, **Fax**, or **Others**) and press

# Edit a Contact

Once you've added a contact, you can add or edit any of the information in the entry, assign a caller ID picture, customize with a unique ringtone, and more.

- 5. Highlight a picture using the navigation keys and press **ASSIGN** (left softkey).
  - If you selected Take New Picture, the camera will launch. Take a new picture and press ASSIGN (left softkey). See Taking Pictures for more information.
  - If you selected My Albums, tap the desired picture and press ASSIGN (left softkey).
- 6. Press **DONE** (left softkey) to save the picture assignment.

### Delete a Contact

You can delete contacts from your contacts list.

1. Display a Contacts entry.

- 2. Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Delete Contact**.
- 3. Press **DELETE** (left softkey) to confirm the deletion.

## Send Contacts via Bluetooth

With the Bluetooth capabilities on your phone, you can transmit contact information to another Bluetooth-compatible phone.

- 1. Highlight a Contacts entry from the Contacts list.
- 2. Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Send Contact**.

Note: A screen will pop up asking you to enable Bluetooth. Press Yes.

- 3. Scroll up or down the Contact entry list using the Up and Down Navigation Keys.
- 4. Highlight an entry and press . A checkmark displays on the left side of the selected Contact entry. You can select multiple entries using the same process.
- 5. Press **SEND CONTACTS** (left softkey)
- 6. Highlight a paired Bluetooth phone to use and press **SELECT** (left softkey) > **Yes**.

With Text Messaging (SMS), you can send and receive instant text messages between your wireless phone and another messaging-ready phone.

Multimedia messages, or MMS, can contain text and pictures, recorded voice, audio or video files, picture slideshows, contact cards (vCard), or appointments (vCalendar).

# Selecting a Text Input Mode

You can choose the text input mode using the following menu.

- 1. From a screen where you can enter text, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) to change the text input mode. For more information, see Compose Text Messages.
- 2. Select one of the following options:
  - Text Mode
    - **Predictive Text** to enter text using a predictive text system that reduces the number of key presses required while entering a word.
    - **Abc** to use multi-tap entry press once for "a," twice for "b", three times for "c."
    - 123 to enter numbers by pressing the numbers on the keypad.
    - Symbols to enter symbols.
    - Smileys to enter "emoticons."
    - Text Settings to turn On or Off the following: Auto-Capital, Auto-Space, Predictive Language, Word Choice List, Word Prediction, Word Completion, and Use My Words.
  - Add Preset Message to enter preprogrammed messages.
  - Add/Change Recipients to add a new recipient using the NEW ADDR key (right softkey) or change the current message recipient to one currently saved in the Contacts List.
  - Add/Change Attachments to change or add a new attachment. To add, select one
    of the following: My Albums, Take new picture, Take new video, or Voice. Change
    the current attachment by selecting or de-selecting it from the CHANGE
    ATTACHMENTS screen.
  - Add/Change Subject Line to enter a new subject or modify the existing subject text.
  - Save as Draft to save the message in the Messages folder before sending it to the recipient.
  - Mark as Urgent to assign a high importance to the message.
  - Set Callback # to add a phone number in the heading informing the recipient of alternate means to respond to the message.

**Tip**: When entering text, press to change letter capitalization (**abc** > **Abc** > **ABC**).

# Text Mode Options

While entering text, you can choose a text entry mode.

#### **ABC Mode**

In Abc mode, also known as multi-tap entry, you press keys one, two, three, or four times to enter the letters you see on the keypad. For example, press once for "a," twice for "b", or three times for "c"; or press once for "p," twice for "q," three times for "r," or four times for "s."

- Select the Abc mode.
- 2. Press the corresponding keys repeatedly until the correct letter appears. (For example, to enter the word "Bill," press twice, twice, three times, and three times again.) (If you make a mistake, press to erase a single character. Press and hold to erase an entire word.)

By default, the first letter of an entry is capitalized and the following letters are lowercased. After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character on a different key.

#### Entering Numbers, Symbols, Smileys and Preset Messages

To enter numbers:

Select the 123 mode and press the appropriate key.

To enter symbols:

➤ Select the Symbols mode. To enter a symbol, press the appropriate key indicated on the display.

To enter "emoticons" (smileys):

► Select the Smileys mode and press the appropriate key.

To enter preset messages:

- 1. Select the Add Preset Message mode.
- 2. Highlight a message and press

**Note**: Preset messages make composing text messages easier by allowing you to enter quick messages, such as "Meet me at," "Can I call you?," or a customized message of your own.

- 3. At the **Connect to Internet?** Prompt, select **Connect**. For more information, see Launching a Web Connection.
- 4. Enter the Title or Artist, use the navigation keys to highlight **Search** and press to initiate the search process.
- 5. Follow the instruction to customize your application and then use the navigation key or press **Menu** (right softkey) to explore your options.

To run applications after they've been loaded:

- 1. Press > My Stuff > Applications > [application]. (The selected application will launch.)
- Use your navigation key or the **TOOLBAR** softkey to explore your options. Web and Data Services.

#### Search for Available Items to Download

- Featured displays a selection of featured items.
- Categories allows you to narrow your search to a general category. (There may be several pages of available content in a list. Select Next 9 to view additional items.)
- **Search** allows you to use your keypad to enter search criteria to locate an item. You may enter an entire word or title or perform a partial-word search.

## Downloading an Item

Once you've selected an item, highlight it and press **Menu/OK**, or press **OK** (left softkey) to download it. You will see a summary page for the item including its title, the vendor, the download details, the file size, and the cost. Links allow you to view the License Details page, which outlines the price, license type, and length of license for the download, and the Terms of Use page, which details the Premium Services Terms of Use and your responsibility for payment.

#### Download a Selected Item

 From the information page, select **Buy**. (The item will download automatically. When you see the New Download screen, you have successfully downloaded the item to your phone.)

**Note**: If you have not previously purchased an item, you will be prompted to create your purchasing profile.

- 2. Select an option to continue:
  - Select Use/Run/View to assign the downloaded item (or to start, in the case of a game or an application). Your data session will end, and you will be redirected to the appropriate phone menu screen.
  - Select Set as to assign a ringer or wallpaper to a phone function.
  - Select Settings to configure downloaded games or applications.

  - Press to close the browser and return to standby mode.

## My Stuff Manager

Whether you purchase your content from your phone or from your online account management page at www.sprint.com, My Stuff Manager stores all of your purchases and you may download them to your phone from there.

This is a storage area on the Nationwide Sprint Network that allows you to store all your purchased files. The files remain in My Stuff Manager until their license terms have expired – even after you have downloaded the content to your phone.

This provides you with a convenient place to access information about your downloaded files without having to store the information in your phone's memory.



► Press > My Stuff > [Application Manager, Games, Social Networking, Ringtones, Wallpaper, Applications, Call Tones].

## Your User Name

When you buy your phone and sign up for service, you're automatically assigned a user name, which is typically based on your name and a number, followed by "@sprintpcs.com." (For example, the third John Smith to sign up for Sprint data services might have jsmith003@sprintpcs.com as his user name.)

When you use data services, your user name is submitted to identify you to the Nationwide Sprint Network. Your user name will be automatically programmed into your phone. You don't have to enter it.

### Finding Your User Name

If you aren't sure what your user name is, you can easily find it on your phone.

► Press > Settings > Phone Information > Phone Number/User ID.

#### **Updating Your User Name**

If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, you must then update the user name on your phone.

► Press > Settings > Others > Data > Update Data Profile. (To cancel, press before completing the update.)

# Launching a Web Connection

You can access the Web from your phone.

► Press > **Web**. (Your data connection starts and you see the SprintWeb<sup>SM</sup> home page.)

While connecting, you may see an animation and a "Connecting" message.

### Data Connection Status and Indicators

Your phone displays the current status of your data connection through indicators at the top of the screen.

The following symbols are used:

Icon	Description
4	Your phone is on and is connected to the Sprint 2G data network. When the arrows are white, your phone is transferring data (for example, when you are opening a Web page) and you can receive calls.
4	When the arrows are gray, your phone is connected to the network but is not currently transferring data (for example, when you are viewing a Web page that is completely open), and you can receive calls. If you do not see an indicator, your phone does not have a current data connection.

**Note**: If Net Guard is enabled and displayed, press **OK** to continue and launch the Web.

Tip: To change the default launch page to the last page you viewed, press TOOLBAR > OPTIONS > Advanced > Startup page and select The last page I viewed.

## Navigating the Web

Navigating through menus and websites during a data session is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for getting around:

## Softkeys

During a data session, the bottom line of your phone's display contains one or more softkeys. These keys are shortcut controls for navigating around the Web, and they correspond to the softkeys directly below the phone's display screen.

To use softkeys:

▶ Press a softkey. (If you see an additional pop-up menu when you press the softkey, select the menu items using your keypad [if they're numbered], or by highlighting the option and pressing ...

Tip: Depending on which websites you visit, the labels on the softkeys may change to indicate their function.

### Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some websites.

To scroll line by line through websites:

► Press the navigation key up and down.

To scroll page by page through websites:

▶ Press the volume buttons on the side of the phone.

#### Selecting

Once you've learned how to use softkeys and scroll, you can start navigating the Web.

To select onscreen items:

▶ Use the navigation key to highlight an item, and then press the left softkey.

Tip: You'll find that the left softkey is used primarily for selecting items. This softkey is often labeled "OK."

If the items on a page are numbered, you can use your keypad (number keys) to select an item. Links, which are displayed as underlined text, allow you to jump to Web pages, select special functions, or even place phone calls.

To select links:

► Highlight the link and press the appropriate softkey.

#### Going Back

To go back one page:

▶ Press BACK the key on your phone.

#### Going Home

To return to the home page from any other page:

► Press **TOOLBAR** (right softkey) > **MY HOMEPAGE**.

## Data Services FAQs

Check our list of FAQs to answer questions you may have about your phone's data services.

#### How will I know when my phone is ready for data service?

Your user name (for example, bsmith01@sprintpcs.com) will be displayed when you press **Settings** > **Phone Information** > **Phone Number/User ID**.

### How do I sign in for the first time?

You are automatically signed in to access data services when you turn on your phone.

#### How do I know when my phone is connected to data services?

Your phone automatically connects when you use data service or an incoming message arrives. You will also see the indicator.

#### Can I make calls and use data services at the same time?

You can receive calls while data is active. You can place an outgoing call anytime, but it will interrupt any in-progress data session.

## When is my data connection active?

Your connection is active when data is being transferred. Outgoing calls are allowed. When active, the indicator is animated on the display screen.

#### When is my data connection dormant?

If your phone receives no data for 10 seconds, the connection goes dormant. When the connection is dormant, you can make and receive voice calls. (The connection may become active again quickly.) If your phone receives no data for an extended period, the connection will terminate.

#### Can I sign out of data services?

You can sign out without turning off your phone; however, you will not be able to browse the Web or use other data services. While signed out, you can still place or receive phone calls, check voicemail, and use other voice services. You may sign in again at any time.

#### To sign out:

- 1. Press > Settings > Others > Data > On/Off.
- 2. Press **NEXT** (left softkey) > **Disable Vision** and press

## Browser

The browser menu offers additional options to expand your use of the Web on your phone. Although the home page offers a broad and convenient array of sites and services for you to browse, not all sites are represented, and certain functions, such as going directly to specific websites, are not available. For these and other functions, you will need to use the browser menu.

## Opening the Browser Menu

The browser menu or toolbar may be opened anytime you have an active data session, from any page you are viewing.

## Open the Browser Toolbar

Press → Web. (Your data connection starts and you see the SprintWeb<sup>SM</sup> home page.)

While connecting, you may see an animation and a "Connecting" message.

2. Press **TOOLBAR** (right softkey). (You will see the browser menu.)

#### **Browser Menu Options**

- **BACK** to visit the previous page.
- FORWARD to move forward a page.

**Note**: You can also use the key for deleting text (like a BACKSPACE key) when you are entering text.

- MY HOMEPAGE returns the browser to the SprintWeb<sup>SM</sup> home page.
- MY PAGES accesses your favorite and recently viewed Web pages.
- **SEARCH** launches the Google<sup>®</sup> search engine.
- OPTIONS accesses the Browser options:
  - Set as Homepage to set the current page as your browser homepage.
  - Font size allows use of a slider to adjust the current text size displayed within the browser. Press **Save** to store your new setting.
  - Send this page to copies the current Web address and attaches it to an outgoing text message.
  - Clear private data allows you to delete the current browsing history, browser cache, cookies, and stored passwords.

- **Help** provides browser shortcut information.
- Advanced allows you to access additional Browser menu options such as: Icon Row, Startup page, Page info, Images on/off, Virtual mouse, Redirect prompt, Send referrer, Turn on error logging, Certificates, Reset browser setting, Reset browser, and About Browser prompt.

### Restarting the Web Browser

If the Web browser seems to be malfunctioning or stops responding, you can usually fix the problem by simply restarting the browser.

► Press **TOOLBAR** (right softkey) > **MY HOMEPAGE**.

### Take a Picture with the Phone Open

1. Press > Photos & Videos > Camera to activate camera mode. Additional camera options are available through the camera mode OPTIONS menu.

**Shortcut**: To activate camera mode menu, you can also press and hold the side camera button ( ) to open the camera function.

- 2. Using the phone's display screen as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
- 3. Press until the shutter sounds. (Your phone automatically saves the picture to the Album.)
- 4. Press to return to camera mode to take another picture.

#### Take a Picture with the Phone Closed

**Note**: The keys are locked when the phone is closed. Press and hold the camera key and volume key together to unlock the keys.

1. Press > Photos & Videos > Camera to activate camera mode.

2. Press to take the picture. (Your phone automatically saves the picture.)

## Displaying the Status

The Status feature allows you to zoom in on an object when you take a picture.

- 1. Press > Photos & Videos > Camera to activate camera mode.
- 2. Press the navigation key up and select an option:
  - Status off removes the status information from the screen.
  - Status on displays the status icons that reflect your current settings.

## Using the Timed Mode

The Timed Mode feature allows you to take a photo within a 5 or 10 second window of time.

- 1. Press > Photos & Videos > Camera to activate camera mode.
- 2. Press the navigation key down and select an option:
  - **OFF** removes the status information from the screen.
  - **5 Sec** gives you a five second time delay before the shutter automatically captures the photo.
  - 10 Sec gives you a ten second time delay before the shutter automatically captures the photo.

## Record Videos

In addition to taking pictures, you can record, view, and send videos with your phone's built-in video camera.

### Accessing the Camcorder

- 1. Press > Photos & Videos > Camcorder to activate camcorder mode.
- 2. Choose a size for the video:
  - Video Mail: Restrict the length of the video so it can be attached to a message.
  - Long Video: Record video of any length.

or

- 1. press and hold the side camera button ( ) to open the camera function.
- 2. Press **OPTIONS** to select Camcorder mode, then choose a size for the video:

- Video Mail: Restrict the length of the video so it can be attached to a message.
- Long Video: Record video of any length.

### **Recording Videos**

- Using the display screen as a viewfinder, compose your video by aiming the lens at your subject.
- 2. Press to start recording. Press again to stop recording.

### Shooting Mode

You can choose from five different shooting modes with your phone's camera.

**Note**: **Single Shot** is the default camera function that allows you to take one shot at a time.

#### **Taking Continuous Shots**

The Continuous shots feature allows you to take either 5 or 10 shots in a continuous sequence. When you take continuous shots, you will see a slider that indicates the shot number sequence.

- From camera mode, press OPTIONS (right softkey) > SHOOTING MODE > Continuous.
- 2. Highlight an option and press
  - Off to deactivate the multiple shots option.

- 5 to take a series of five pictures
- 10 to take a series of 10 pictures.

**Note**: The **Continuous** setting will automatically set the shot image size to 320 x 240.

- 3. Using the phone's display screen as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
- 4. Press until the shutter sounds. (Your phone automatically saves the picture to the Album.)
- 5. Press to return to camera mode to take another picture.

- or -

Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Review Album** to review your continuous shot frames.

### Taking Mosaic Shots

The Mosaic shots feature allows you to take 4 shots in a continuous sequence.

- 1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **SHOOTING MODE** > **Mosaic**.
- 2. Highlight an option and press
  - Off to deactivate the multiple shots option.
  - 4 to take a series in mosaic format.

**Note**: The Mosaic setting will automatically set the shot image size to 480 x 640.

- Move the camera toward the desired direction.
- 4. Press to take the pictures.

**Note**: Your phone automatically saves the pictures in your Album. The Mosaic shots will display as one photo split into a four-part grid

### Taking Panorama Shots

This feature allows you to take landscape-oriented or panoramic photos. You can also move the camera left to right or up and down for a wider range of the desired image. The camera will capture a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 8 shots to produce a panoramic image.

- 1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **SHOOTING MODE** > **Panorama**.
- 2. Highlight an option and press:
  - Off to deactivate the panoramic option.

• On to activate the panoramic option.

**Note**: The Panoramic setting will automatically set the shot image size to 320 x 240.

- 3. Move the camera toward the desired direction.
- 4. Press only once to begin the panoramic photo process.
- 5. Move the camera slowly from left to right, ensuring that the red frame evenly surrounds the screen during each automated shot.

**Note**: The camera will not capture a photo unless the red frame evenly surrounds the screen.

- 6. After completion, your phone will compile the separate shots into one image and save it to your Album.
- 7. Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Review Album** to view your panoramic photo.

### **Taking Night Shots**

Night shots allow you to activate low light image capture. Enabling this feature allows you to take better quality photos in low light conditions.

- 1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **SHOOTING MODE** > **Night Shot**.
- 2. Highlight an option and press
  - Off to deactivate the night shot option.
  - On to activate the night shot option.
- 3. Move the camera toward the desired direction.
- 4. Press to take the photo.

## Adjusting the Resolution

You can adjust the resolution of the photos you take.

- 1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey).
- 2. Use the right navigation key and highlight **Resolution**.
- 3. Select 2M, 1.3M, High, Med, or Low.

### Adjusting the White Balance

You can adjust the white balance setting on your phone's camera.

1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey).

- 2. Use the right navigation key and highlight **WHITE BALANCE**.
- 3. Select one of the following:
  - Auto The white balance has been set to Automatic. Use this for taking pictures indoors or outdoors using automatic white balance settings.
  - Daylight The white balance has been set to Sunny. Use this for taking pictures or movies outdoors on bright sunny days.
  - Cloudy The white balance has been set to Cloudy. Use this for taking pictures or movies outdoors under cloudy conditions.
  - Incandescent The white balance has been set to Tungsten. Use this for taking pictures or movies indoors under normal lighting conditions.
  - **Fluorescent** The white balance has been set to Fluorescent. Use this for taking pictures or movies indoors under fluorescent lighting conditions.
  - Manual The white balance has been set to Manual. Use this for taking pictures indoors or outdoors using your own custom settings.

## Adjusting Color Tones

Select a color tone for your photos.

- 1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey).
- Use the right navigation key and highlight EFFECT.
- 3. Use your right and left navigation keys to view the color previews.
- 4. Select a color tone.

## Adjusting the Quality

Your phone's camera quality settings include **Fine**, **Normal**, and **Economy**.

- 1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey).
- 2. Use the right navigation key and highlight **QUALITY**.
- 3. Select Fine, Normal, or Economy.

### Adjusting the Shutter Sound

You can choose how the shutter will sound as you snap a picture.

- 1. From camera mode, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey).
- 2. Use the right navigation key and highlight Shutter Sound.

3. Select Shutter1, Shutter2 or Shutter3.

### Adjusting the Grid

This feature allows you to adjust the camera's grid.

- 1. From camera mode, press the down navigation key and highlight **Grid**.
- 2. Select Off or On.

## Adjusting the Brightness

This feature allows you to adjust the brightness of the picture.

- ► From camera mode, press the navigation key left or right. (You will see the gauge bar.)
  - Press the right to increase the brightness or the left navigation key to decrease it.

# Sending a Picture

Once you have taken a photo, you can use the messaging capabilities of your phone to instantly share it with family and friends.

#### Send a Photo to a Contact

- 1. Take a picture.
- 2. With the picture displayed, press **SEND** (left softkey).
- 3. Select a listed contact or one of the following options:
  - Go to Contacts to select a recipient from your phonebook entries.
  - MULTIPLE (left softkey) to select multiple contacts from the list of recent recipients.
  - NEW ADDR (right softkey) to enter a new Phone Number or Email Address.
- 4. Press **CONTINUE** (left softkey).
- 5. Compose a message in the space provided.
- Press OPTIONS (right softkey) to display a list of optional sending, marking, and text input choices. (Text Mode, Add Preset Message, Add/Change Recipient, Add/Change Attachment, Add/Change Subject, Save as Draft, Mark as Urgent, and Set Callback #.)
- 7. Press **SEND** (left softkey).

# Sending a Video

Once you have recorded a video, you can use the messaging capabilities of your phone to instantly share it with family and friends.

#### Send a Photo to a Contact

- 1. Record a video.
- 2. With the video displayed, press **SEND** (left softkey).
- 3. Select a listed contact or one of the following options:
  - Contact to select a recipient from your phonebook entries and send the video via MMS message.
  - Bluetooth (left softkey) to send the video via Bluetooth device. For more information, see Turning Bluetooth On and Off.
  - Upload/Publish (right softkey) to upload your video to the Web.

# Assigning Photos

After taking a picture, assign it as a wallpaper or as a picture ID for a Contacts entry.

- 1. Take a picture.
- 2. With the picture displayed, press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Assign** and select an option.
  - Picture ID to assign the picture to a Contacts entry.
  - Select one of the following options:
    - Contacts
    - Unsaved Numbers
    - Private / Unknown
  - Wallpaper to assign the picture as a screen saver.
- 3. Highlight an entry and press to assign the picture.

## Alarm

Your phone comes with a built-in alarm clock that has multiple alarm capabilities.

- 1. Press > Tools > Alarm.
- 2. Press CREATE NEW (left softkey).
- 3. Highlight the **ALARM** field to turn the alarm on or off.
- 4. Select a time for the alarm.
  - Select AM or PM by pressing the right softkey.
- 5. Select a ringtone type for the alarm by highlighting the ringtone field and pressing
- 6. Select a repeating status for the alarm by highlighting the repeat field and pressing
  - Highlight Daily, Once, or select individual days of the week and press DONE (left softkey).
- 7. Select a **Snooze Interval** using the right and left navigation keys.

- Select an interval of 5 minutes, 10 Minutes, 15 Minutes, 20 Minutes, or Off to disallow the Snooze feature.
- 8. Select a **Volume** level using the right and left navigation keys.
- 9. Press **DONE** (left softkey).

## Calendar

Your phone's Calendar tool helps you organize your time and you can set it to remind you of important events.

## Viewing the Current Day's Schedule

Your phone comes in handy for checking your current day's schedule.

► Press > Tools > Calendar > Today.

## Viewing the Calendar

You can view the calendar in several different ways, including month or day view.

► Press > Tools > Calendar > Scheduler.

#### Jumping to Another Date

► Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Jump to date**.

## Adding a Schedule

Use your phone's scheduler to add events to your calendar.

- 1. Press > Tools > Calendar > Scheduler.
- 2. Highlight the day to which you would like to add an event and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Add New**.

- 3. Enter the event title information and press **NEXT** (left softkey).
- 4. Select an event type using your navigation keys to scroll left or right.
- 5. Select an alarm time for the event using your navigation keys to scroll left or right. You can choose **No Alarm**, **On Time**, **10 Min. Before**, **30 Min. Before**, or **1 Hour Before**.

Note: The default alarm time is 10 Min. Before.

- 6. Select a repeating status for the event using your navigation keys to scroll left or right.
- 7. Select a ringtone type for the alarm by highlighting the ringtone field and pressing
- 8. Select a **Start** and **End** time and date for the event.
- 9. Select Go to Contact to select one or more contacts to associate with this event.
- 10. Press **DONE** (left softkey) to save the event.

## Viewing the Task List

The Task List displays a summary of your upcoming events in chronological order. Each entry displays its relative priority, due time, due date, and whether or not the task was missed.

► Press > Tools > Calendar > Task List.

## Viewing the Countdown

The Countdown List displays the number of days that remain until specific scheduled events. If the event itself was missed or ignored through your event alerts, that event displays the number of days passed since the scheduled time.

► Press > Tools > Calendar > Countdown.

### Jumping to Another Date

► Press **OPTIONS** (left softkey) > **Jump to date**.

## Managing the Schedule Alerts

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone alerts you and displays the event summary. There are several ways your phone alerts you to scheduled events:

- By playing the assigned ringtone type.
- By illuminating the backlight.
- By flashing the LED.

- 1. To silence the alarm and reset the schedule, press any key except the navigation keys.
- 2. To view additional options, press the appropriate option:
  - Snooze silences the alarm and schedules it to replay again in 10 minutes.
  - View displays the event detail screen.
  - Dismiss (right softkey) stops the alarm and eliminates any further notices about the event.

## Erasing Events

You can delete events scheduled for a specific time and date.

### Erasing a Day's Events

- 1. Press > Tools > Calendar > Scheduler.
- 2. Highlight the day for which you would like to erase events and press
- 3. Highlight the event you want to erase and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Delete**.
- 4. Select **Yes** (left softkey) or **No** (right softkey).

### **Erasing All Events**

You have the option of deleting all events scheduled before a specific time and date.

- 1. Press > Tools > Calendar > Scheduler.
- 2. Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Delete All.**
- 3. Select **Yes** (left softkey) or **No** (right softkey).

## Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth phones, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is usually up to approximately 30 feet.

## Turning Bluetooth On and Off

Before using Bluetooth, you must turn it on. By default, your phone's Bluetooth feature is set to **Off**. Turning Bluetooth on makes your phone "discoverable" by other in-range Bluetooth phones.

#### Turn Bluetooth On

- 1. Press > Tools > Bluetooth.
- 2. Highlight **On** and press to enable Bluetooth.

#### Turn Bluetooth Off

- 1. Press > Tools > Bluetooth.
- 2. Highlight **Off** and press to disable Bluetooth.

## Using the Bluetooth Settings Menu

The Bluetooth menu allows you to set up many of the characteristics of your phone's Bluetooth service. These include:

- Entering or changing the name your phone uses for Bluetooth communication.
- Setting your phone's visibility (or "discoverability") for other Bluetooth phones.
- Displaying your phone's Bluetooth address.

To access the Bluetooth Settings menu:

- 1 Press > Tools > Bluetooth
- 2. Set your Bluetooth options.
  - Highlight My Bluetooth Info and press EDIT (left softkey) to rename your phone for Bluetooth.
  - Select Visibility > Always Visible, Visible for 3 Min, or Hidden to set your Bluetooth visibility.
  - Select My Bluetooth Info to display your phone's Bluetooth profiles and address.

### Pairing Bluetooth Phones

The Bluetooth pairing process allows you to establish trusted connections between your phone and another Bluetooth phone. When you pair phones, they share a passkey, allowing for fast, secure connections while bypassing the discovery and authentication process.

#### Pair with Another Bluetooth Phone

1. Press > Tools > Bluetooth > Add New > < Search >. (Your phone will display a list of discovered in-range Bluetooth phones.)

2. Highlight a phone and press

3. Enter the PIN code and press

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible phones, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth-compatible phones

# **Updating Phone**

From time to time, software updates may be available for your phone.

### Download Software Updates to Your Phone

- 1. Press > Tools > Update Phone.
- Press Update Firmware to update your phone's software version or Update PRL to update the list of geographic areas your phone can use during roaming. (Your phone automatically downloads and installs any available updates. You may be required to power your phone off and back on to complete the software upgrade.)

## Voice Service

Your phone's voice service capabilities make it possible for you to complete tasks such as dialing a phone number in your Contacts simply by talking into your phone.

Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)

#### **ASR Options**

## Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)

You can use your phone's built-in automatic speech recognition (ASR) software to dial a phone number in your Contacts or to launch phone functions. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and ASR will recognize your voice and complete tasks by itself.

### Activating ASR

The screen displays "Say a command" and the phone prompts you to say the name of the command you want to use. To complete your task, simply follow the voice prompts.

Available ASR commands include:

- Call <name or #> to call an entry in your Contacts list or a spoken phone number.
- Send Text <Name or #> to send a text message to the spoken name or phone number.
- **Lookup** < Name > to lookup the spoken contact name.
- Go To <Menu> to jump directly to menu items or applications.
- Check < Item> to check your phone's status.

**Tip**: Use ASR in a quiet environment so it can accurately recognize your commands.

### Making a Voice Call with ASR

- 1. Press and hold
- 2. If you hear "Say a command," say "Call."
- 3. If you hear "Say the name or number," say a name or a phone number.
- 4. If you hear "Which location?", say a number type (for example, "Mobile").

Tip: You can skip steps 3 and 4 by saying a name and location after "Call" without pausing (for example, "Call John Jones mobile").

Note: If ASR does not recognize the name or number, it will find the most likely matches and display a list of up to three names or numbers. You will hear "Did you say..." followed by the name or number. You can confirm by saying "Yes." Say "No" to change the selection.

#### Opening Menus with ASR

You can jump directly to many menu items or applications by saying "Go to" followed by a menu option.

- 1. Press and hold
- 2. If you hear "Say a command," say "Go To."
- 3. If you hear "Which shortcut?", say an application name (for example, "Messages").
- 4. The phone opens the selected menu.

### Checking Phone Status Using ASR

You can use ASR to obtain information about your phone:

- Status
- Time
- Signal Strength
- Network
- Battery
- My Phone Number
- 1. Press and hold
- 2. If you hear "Say a command," say "Check."
- 3. If you hear "Which status item?," say a command.

## **ASR Options**

The ASR options menu allows you to modify confirmations prompts, voice adaptations, and ASR modes.

### Change ASR Confirmation

- 1. Press and hold
- 2. Press **SETTINGS** (right softkey) > **Confirmation** and select an option.
  - Automatic to ask for confirmation only when the system is not sure what you said.
  - Always Confirm to always ask for confirmation.
  - Never Confirm to never ask for confirmation.

### Adapt the System to Your Voice

- 1. Press and hold
- 2. Press **SETTINGS** (right softkey) > **Adaptation** > **Adapt Voice**.
- 3. Press **START** (left softkey) and repeat each word, phrase, or telephone number you hear.

#### Reset the Adaptation

- 1. Press and hold
- 2. Press **SETTINGS** (right softkey) > **Adaptation** > **Reset Voice** > **Yes** (left softkey).

### Change the ASR Mode

- 1. Press and hold
- 2. Press **SETTINGS** (right softkey) > **Audio Modes** and select an option.
  - Expert Mode to sound a beep only.
  - Prompt Mode to prompt for required information.

# Calculator

Your phone comes with a built-in calculator and handy tip and eco-calculators for figuring tip percentages and miles-per-gallon.

### Tip Calculator

#### **Eco Calculator**

- 1. Press > Tools > Calculator > Calculator.
- 2. Enter numbers using your keypad.
  - Press \*set to enter decimal points.
  - Press to change the sign from positive to negative.
  - Press CLEAR (right softkey) to clear all numbers.
- 3. Press for the calculation result.

### Tip Calculator

With the tip calculator, you can configure the tip percentage you owe on a bill.

- 1. Press > Tools > Calculator > Tip Calculator.
- Use your keypad and navigation key to enter the Bill (\$) amount, Tip (%), and # Paying.
  - The **Tip (\$)** displays the amount you pay for a tip and **You pay** displays the total amount you pay on the bill.

### Eco Calculator

Your phone comes with an eco calculator that allows you to configure the amount you pay per gallon of fuel and the resulting efficiency of your car's mileage.

To calculate your car's price of fuel per gallon:

- 1. Press > Tools > Calculator > Eco Calculator.
- 2. Press CREATE (left softkey).
- 3. Use your keypad and navigation key to enter the **Distance (mi)**, **Fuel (\$)**, **(gallon)**, and **Price (\$/gallon)** amounts.
  - The calculator displays the (\$/mile) and (gallon/mile) efficiency amounts.

## Device Self Service

This built-in service on your phone allows you to activate your phone manually via a Webenabled UI.

- 1. Press > Tools > Device Self Service.
- 2. Follow the onscreen prompts to manually activate your new phone.

## World Time

Your phone gives you the capability to view the time in over 50 different locations around the world.

- 1. Press > Tools > World Time.
- 2. Use your right or left navigation keys to scroll through the list of cities.
- 3. Press SET DST (left softkey) to turn Daylight Savings Time On or Off.

## Memo Pad

Your phone comes with a memo pad that you can use to compose and store reminders and notes to help keep you organized.

### Compose a Memo

- 1. Press > Tools > Memo Pad > ADD NEW.
- 2. Type your note using the keypad and press **Done**.

#### Read a Saved Note

- 1. Press > Tools > Memo Pad.
- 2. Highlight a note and press

#### **Delete Saved Notes**

- 1. Press > Tools > Memo Pad.
- 2. Highlight a note and press ...
- 3. Press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Delete** > **Yes** (left softkey).

### Voice Memos

Use your phone's Voice Memo feature to record brief memos to remind you of important events, phone numbers, or grocery list items and to record conversations during a call.

**Note**: Your phone can store 1 minute of memos during a call and 2 minutes within the **Tools** menu.

## Recording a Current Call

With your phone's Voice Memo feature, you can record a phone call while you are on the call.

- While on a call, press OPTIONS (right softkey) > Voice Memo to begin recording the call.
- 2. To pause the recording, press **PAUSE** (left softkey), or press **STOP** (left softkey) to stop recording.

## Recording Voice Memos

Recording Voice Memos is as easy as speaking into your phone.

- 1. Press > Tools > Voice Memo > Record.
- 2. Begin recording after the voice prompt.

### End a Memo Recording

► Press or **FINISH** (right softkey).

## Playing Voice Memos

You can play and review the voice memos you have recorded.

- 1. Press > Tools > Voice Memo > Review.
- 2. Highlight the Memo you want to play and press **REVIEW** (left softkey).

## Erasing Voice Memos

You can erase voice memos that you have previously recorded.

- 1. Press > Tools > Voice Memo > Review.
- 2. Highlight the Memo you want to erase and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Delete** > **DELETE** (left softkey).

#### Erase All Voice Memos

- 1. Press > Tools > Voice Memo > Review.
- 2. Press **OPTIONS** > **Delete All** > **DELETE** (left softkey).

## Editing Voice Memos

You can edit the titles or captions you assign to voice memos.

- 1. Press > Tools > Voice Memo > Review.
- 2. Highlight the Memo you want to edit, and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Edit Caption**.
- 3. Enter the new title and press **DONE** (left softkey).

### Check Voice Memo Information

You can check information about your voice memos such as length, and time and date of the recording.

- 1. Press > Tools > Voice Memo > Review.
- 2. Highlight the Memo whose information you want to view and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Info**.
- 3. Check the information and press **DONE** (left softkey).

## Send a Voice Memo Message





- 2. Highlight the Memo you want to send and press **OPTIONS** (right softkey) > **Send Message**.
- 3. Select the message recipient and press . See Compose Text Messages for more information

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
